

UPDATES AT THE POOL AND CLUBHOUSE

With the Arizona COVID-19 numbers continuing to climb, we continue to monitor the situation to determine when the clubhouse will be able to open. At this time, the only things open are the pool and spa. Up to 4 persons are allowed in the pool at one time and up to 2 persons are allowed in the spa, but no more than 4 individuals are allowed in the pool area at one time. There is a sign-up sheet to list up to four individuals for each 1-hour block of time. **THERE ARE NEW POOL KEYS.** If you do not have a new pool key and would like one, please contact Jane Brunckhorst at 520-204-0057.

Currently, we are open with the following guidelines, which are posted on the gate to the pool area:

ENTER AT YOUR OWN RISK

-Do not enter if you are feeling ill or you are a high-risk individual.

-Maintain distance of 6' at all times.

-2 chairs and 2 loungers to remain in designated spots.

-A maximum of 4 Viewpoint residents allowed in area at any one time. This includes a maximum of

2 residents in the spa at any one time.

-No guests or children allowed.

-Wear facial masks when out of pool. Do not wear masks when swimming.

-Residents must use their own hand sanitizer and sanitizing wipes to clean chairs, handrails, or any previously touched surfaces before exiting area.

-There is no access to bathrooms.

-Pool/Spa hours: 10:00 am – 7:00 pm

SIGN IN/OUT SHEET TO RESERVE TIME: Sign in/out to reserve time to use the pool/spa.

CLOSURES:

-Entire clubhouse is closed at this time.

-Side storage room is also closed.

-Water fountain is closed.

Volunteers who test pool and spa in the morning will also sanitize chairs, gate, outside shower handles, etc.

MORE UPDATES AT THE POOL

As with all things, as they age, things will break. Recently, we noticed that the pool cover was not working. Until we get it fixed, the pool cover will be staying open.

As well, the cover on the spa tore, and we had to replace that. That repair/replacement was a lot less expensive than it will be for the pool cover. The new one looks very nice. Our pool monitors uncover the spa and replace the cover at the end of the day.

And, finally . . . this one is going to take a little while. We recently noticed that the caulking has broken free near the hand rail at the entrance of the pool. It was determined that there is a pipe to the pool-fill valve that has developed a leak and has already damaged some of the caulking. This will require cutting the pool decking around the fill valve, replacing the broken pipe, and repairing the damaged areas. This will take several days to complete, and may required closing the pool for a day or so at some point to allow repairs to "cure". Stay tuned for timing on that one.

POOL VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Many of our friends have gone to their summer homes or are on extended vacations. Those of us left here in Viewpoint are keeping things going as needed and watching our yards for weeds (if the Monsoons finally come).

Currently, we have a few volunteers now, but could always use more. The Pool Volunteers sign up for one week at a time. They open the pool by 10:00 a.m. and close it at 7:00 p.m. At each of those times, they test the ph level in both the pool and spa. They record the results in the book. They spray down the chairs, handles of the outdoor shower, the handrails to the pool and spa, and the gate.
